Starfish Preschool

Starfish have made the most of the sunshine this week and the heat has not stopped their learning.

Throughout the week, we have talked about how we can stay safe in the sun and why it is important. Everytime we went into our outside area, the children remembered to check they were wearing a sun hat, they had plenty to drink and had a top up of sun cream after lunch.



Whilst in the outside area, the children worked collaboratively to make music! They used lots of different instruments and played them all together, keeping to a steady beat and even creating songs to go with it. It was lovely to see them all work together to create and explore.



We have also created our own suns to hang in the classroom. The children painted paper plates yellow and then used different yellow materials to collage their sun. They were very creative and

used the scissors to cut the yellow paper and card into different shapes and sizes.

In phonics, we have continued to learn new sounds and the children

have now been introduced to the 's', 'a', 't' and 'p' sounds. They have been brilliant at listening out for words that start with those letters. We have also been looking at syllables and worked out how many syllables are in each of our names with the most being 4 and the least being 1.



Seahorse class

What a creative week in Seahorses! We started the week by learning about African art and how varied it is. Reception made some African Necklaces using paper plates and showed some super paintbrush control. Meanwhile year 1 and 2 started looking at African masks, what they can be made from, the colours used and when they are worn. Then we designed our own in our sketchbooks ready for Wednesday and Thursday when we started painting them. We are looking forward to displaying them on top of the lockers along with some more artwork we will be doing next week.



In maths reception have been learning about sharing amounts and have worked very hard to share cookies between the Monsters. Reception have also been keeping diaries this week writing about what they did the day before. We have noticed how well they are using their phonics to help their spelling.

Year 1 and 2 have started looking at positional language and describing movement in maths this week. There has been a big push to make sure we know our left and our right. They have also finished writing their recounts about project week

and finished this unit off by writing a recount of their day.

In English, we have continued with our topic on 'The Wind in the Willows', creating some fantastic sentences full of great adventures with Toad, Mole and Ratty.


Over in maths, the class has moved away from working with time and on to perimeter. We have been honing our measuring skills to ensure we are correctly measuring the outside of shapes.

All in-term holiday requests will be classed as unauthorised absences. This will likely result in a fixed penalty notice being issued from Norfolk County Council.

In Norfolk, penalty notices are issued in accordance with the Norfolk Local Protocol. In all cases a penalty notice can only be issued if the pupil has accrued at least 9 sessions (4.5 school days) of unauthorised absence within the previous 6 school weeks. This would result in a fine of £60 per child per parent ie; for a family with 2 children this would total £240
