Starfish Preschool

We may have only been in school two days this week, but they have been an amazing

The children have been very excited to come back to Starfish and tell us all their news from the 6 weeks holiday, making sure they took turns, using their listening ears to know when to talk and when to listen to their friends.

Starfish have also been busy exploring the classroom this week, and looking at the different areas. They have been especially keen to paint in our new painting tray. Using only 3 colours, the children used their imagination to paint people,







during the summer.

In our outside area, the children have tried to keep cool by playing with ice and water in the tuff tray and chose to add a variety of sea creatures to splash around with.

In the mud kitchen. Starfish have used the bark and water to create different flavoured pies and teas for the adults and their friends to try. They even reminded us to blow on our food in case it was too hot!

This short week has been 'learning to learn' week, where the children have been

discovering how we learn and develop. This has included learning about how to have a growth mindset, using the power of yet, the learning pit and our JONK characteristics to support our learning.

For the resourceful and creative JONK we had to create a boat using items in the classroom that we thought would float. For curiosity we investigated different questions that intrigued us and for resilience we tried to solve some hard puzzles.

The class has worked so hard this week and I am looking forward to the learning journey we are going to have this year together!



All in-term holiday requests will be classed as unauthorised absences. This will likely result in a fixed penalty notice being issued from Norfolk County Council.

In Norfolk, penalty notices are issued in accordance with the Norfolk Local Protocol. In all cases a penalty notice can only be issued if the pupil has accrued at least 9 sessions (4.5 school days) of unauthorised absence within the previous 6 school weeks. This would result in a fine of £60 per child per parent ie; for a family with 2 children this would total £240
