Another Fantastic Week - 'Growing Together'

Friday 2nd February we are 'Dressing up for Digits' while raising money to support NSPCC services such as Speak out Stay safe and Childline. The children can choose to dress as a digit, we are looking forward to seeing the different ways they can dress to support an important cause. Donations can be made on School Money. The money raised will then be sent to the NSPCC.

Starfish Preschool

The children have had a very caring week in Starfish this week.

We have been busy talking about people who help us, naming people like doctors, nurses, vets, teachers and our mums and dads. The children have been using the first aid kits to play doctors and help each other to feel better after 'hurting' their legs, arms and heads. They were brilliant at making sure their 'patients' were all bandaged up!

The children have also been role playing with the pirate ship. Each pirate has been given their own name and personality and the children have been using this to help extend their play, making stories about where the pirates have been sailing to and what treasure they might find there.

We then sat on the carpet and got into partners, singing along to 'Row, Row, Row Your Boat' and pretending to be the boats. The children loved learning the different verses and singing all together.

Starfish have also continued their phonics learning and have now met Brown Owl. They are doing so well at remembering the characters' names, the sounds they make and facts about the Monsters.



Seahorse class

We have had another amazing week. We have started looking at postcards in year 1 and 2. This has been a part of our English work based on the book 'At the Beach' where a young boy called Henry sends postcards whilst on holiday at Crabby Spits. On Thursday we then wrote our own postcards telling other people about our holidays and trips we had been on. Meanwhile, Reception have been writing about a magical island and the different animals on it after watching a short clip from Noah's Island.

In maths, Reception have been looking at the height of different objects and had a race to see who could build the tallest beanstalk. They then put them in order from shortest to tallest. Key Stage 1 have been looking at counting in twos, fives and tens. We are now beginning to look at coins and the different amounts they represent. Next week we will combine both pieces of learning to count amounts of money.

In topic, Year 1 and 2 began learning about Aboriginals and how they are indigenous to Australia. We learnt that they move around, hunt for only what they need and do not waste things.

Dolphins

This week in Dolphins, we have been investigating what climate change is and how it is affecting the world that we live in. We started the week researching who Greta Thunberg is and how she has become one of the world's leading climate change activists from such a young age. This led to us discussing the impacts the world warming up is having and what this may potentially mean in the future.

In English, we are using our new learning to start writing a letter to Greta Thunberg about how we are going to make a positive impact against climate change. We have

practised writing a letter to Mr Hopkins, making sure we have the correct layout and shape when writing a formal letter. Next week we will progress on to writing to Greta with all our ideas.

Topic has run hand in hand with English as we investigated what climate change is, how the build up of greenhouse gases is warming up the Earth and what impact this has on the habitats of the planet. We then started planning our very own podcast, discussing the impacts of climate change. The class have started writing their scripts and will start recording their podcast at the beginning of next week.

Over in maths, Dolphins have moved away from a successful unit on addition and subtraction and on to multiplication and division. We have focused on multiplication this week and how we can use repeated addition to support our multiplication. We have been using an array of representations to support our learning, with one of the class favourites being ice cream representations, although we wished we had the real thing instead of images.



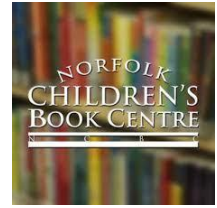
Sharks

In writing, we have started writing formal letters highlighting the issues of climate change in order to inspire our leaders to do things!

Library

They will be classifying all our non-fiction books, organising our fiction and providing us with some new and exciting books. We are looking forward to seeing the end result.



Mental Wellbeing



This week we have continued working on The Big School' Birdwatch. The children have been colouring in birds during their lunch break to create a display board. This week we introduced origami birds to our activities. If your child would like to take photos of birds or create bird art please send them in to Mrs Winchester. This weekend the RSPB is having a Big Birdwatch so keep a tally of the different types of birds you see around your home.

Saturday is Holocaust Memorial Day. The children, with Mrs Winchester, have been working on reflection flames to create a new display. KS2 previously worked on the Battle of Britain and WW2 and thoroughly enjoyed these sessions. Reflecting on history is important as we remember those who made history and prevent some histories from repeating themselves.

We have had some great photos sent in by families of equipment being used that they have borrowed.

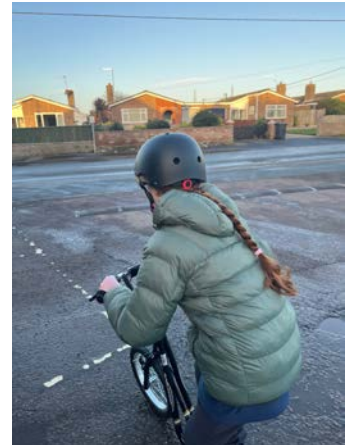

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

AGE-INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

While TikTok's "Following" feed only displays videos from users someone follows, "For You" is a stream of clips based on their previously watched content. Most videos on a child's "For You" feed will therefore be light-hearted and amusing, but it could potentially surface something unsuitable. TikTok's guidelines prohibit the sharing of illegal or inappropriate content, but the sheer volume of uploads mean they aren't manually monitored and vetted.

DAINGEROUS CHALLENGES

Due to TikTok's immense popularity, some young people have unfortunately been influenced by videos challenging them to perform harmful, criminal or even deadly acts. One extreme example was the "blackout" trend, which encouraged users to hold their breath until they passed out from a lack of oxygen. It led to two families filing lawsuits against TikTok over the tragic deaths of their children.

CONTACT WITH STRANGERS

With around 1.1 billion users globally, the potential for contact from strangers on TikTok is high – especially as accounts created by over-18s (or youngsters using a false date of birth) are set to public by default. This not only means that someone's profile is visible to everyone else on the app, it also lets their videos be suggested to others and enables anyone to comment on them or download them.

IN-APP SPENDING

TikTok is free, but users have the option to buy TikTok coins, which can be used to purchase emojis in the app. These emojis are then sent as rewards (retaining their monetary value) to other users for videos they've created. Coin bundles range from £9.99 to an eye-watering £99; TikTok's policy is that they can't be bought by under-18s, but it's possible to bypass this with a fake birthdate.

ADDICTIVE NATURE

TikTok can be addictive, especially for young people: compulsive repeated use can interfere with sleep patterns and be a distraction from other activities. The platform recently introduced default usage time limits of 60 and 100 minutes for new members under 18 (in the UK, children with TikTok average 102 minutes per day on the app), but these restrictions can easily be removed in the settings.

TIKTOK NOW

Introduced in late 2022, the "TikTok Now" feature lets users post a daily video or photo at the exact same time as their friends. Users receive a synchronised notification at a random time of day, giving them three minutes to take a video or real-time photo. This addition can not only be a distraction to young people but could lead to them inadvertently sharing private content such as their location.

Advice for Parents & Carers

ENABLE FAMILY PAIRING

Family Pairing allows parents to link their TikTok account with their child's and control their settings remotely. Parents can then, for example, turn on Restricted Mode (reducing the chances of a child seeing inappropriate content); set screen time limits; and manage their child's ability to send messages (and to whom). Children can't alter these settings without parental approval.

MAKE ACCOUNTS PRIVATE

Although under-18s will have their TikTok account set to private by default, bypassing this setting is relatively easy. However, parents have the ability to manually set their child's account to private – meaning that their videos won't be visible to strangers and they won't be able to exchange messages with people who aren't on their friends list.

LIMIT IN-APP SPENDING

If your child is using an iPhone or Android device to access TikTok, you can alter the settings to prevent them from making in-app purchases. We'd recommend that you enable this feature, as it's quite easy for a young person – without realising what they're doing – to spend a significant amount of real money buying TikTok coins so they can unlock more features of the app.

DISCUSS THE DANGERS

If your child wants to use TikTok and you're happy for them to do so, it's crucial to talk about the potential risks in this type of app. For example, ensure they understand not to share any identifying personal information – and that they realise they could be exposed to inappropriate content. Thinking critically about what they see on TikTok can help children become generally more social media savvy.

READ THE SIGNS

If you're concerned that your child might be spending too much time on TikTok, or that they've been emotionally affected by something inappropriate or upsetting that they've seen, it's important to know how to spot the possible signs. Increased irritability and a lack of concentration are potential red flags, as are failing to complete homework or regularly not eating meals.

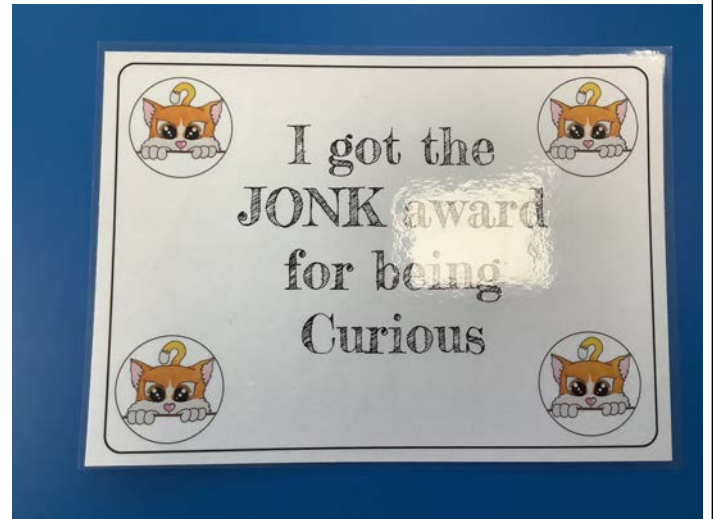

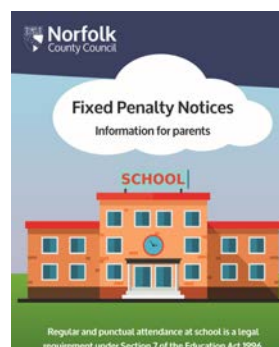

All in-term holiday requests will be classed as unauthorised absences. This will likely result in a fixed penalty notice being issued from Norfolk County Council.

In Norfolk, penalty notices are issued in accordance with the Norfolk Local Protocol. In all cases a penalty notice can only be issued if the pupil has accrued at least 9 sessions (4.5 school days) of unauthorised absence within the previous 6 school weeks. This would result in a fine of £60 per child per parent ie; for a family with 2 children this would total £240
