Starfish Preschool

Starfish have had an amazing week!

This week we have been focusing on who helps our animals. We talked about our pets and where we take them when they are poorly, and who might look after animals that live in zoos and animal shelters. The children then used our first aid kits and the toy animals to help role play being a vet and making the animals feel better.

In our creative tray, the children have been exploring paint colours and mixing these together to make new colours.

When most of the paint had been mixed together, the children noticed they could make marks in the paint and began to draw pictures, patterns and even some of the letters of their name.

The children have also been mark making outside on the chalkboards; writing the first letter of their name and even other letters, for example, an 'M' for Mum!



Starfish have also been working on their collaborative skills and have been playing together, sharing their ideas to extend their play.

They have tried really hard to listen to each other and have supported some of our newer children to join in too!



Seahorse class

This week in Seahorses we have carried on with our learning about Australia and reception spent some of their topic time decorating Australian animals having looked at Aboriginal art. They also



looked at Edward the Emu in Drawing club. They thought about the other animals Edward could go and see as well as thinking about what Edward and Edwina the emus

could go and do. In maths they have been busy comparing the height and lengths of different objects and on Thursday started looking at the days of the week. We read Jasper's Beanstalk and managed to sequence the pictures to match the story.



Meanwhile in Year 1 and Year 2 we have been busy finishing 'At the Beach' by writing our own postcards about a trip we have been on. To help us prepare for this we practised writing lots of different things during our sentence stacking lessons during the week. On Thursday we had some great similes including 'as black as a shadow' and 'as long as a boat'. In maths, we have been using our knowledge of coins and the 2, 5 and 10 times tables to count different values of coins.

Next week, year 2 are going to Cromer Academy for Trigolf on Tuesday and we are looking forward to seeing what they can teach us when they come back.



Dolphins

This week in Dolphins we have been finalising our letters to send to Greta Thunberg. The children have been very excited about writing their letters and have been asking everyday when they are going to be able to write them. Throughout the week as a class we have written each stage of the letter, then on Friday we wrote up our first draft. The letter will be written up on Monday and sent over to Greta in Sweden.

In Topic we have moved on to a mini music unit. In this unit we are going to practise and perform the song 'Big Yellow Taxi' by Joni Mitchell. On Wednesday, we listened to the song and wrote a review about what we liked and didn't like. The majority of the class enjoyed the song, with each enjoying a different part of it.

In maths, we have been working hard noticing links between the 2, 5 and 10 times tables and how to group for division. The times table the children were very confident with, whereas for division we were resilient breaking the learning down with manipulatives to make sure we all understood how we can divide in groups.

Sharks

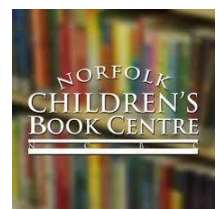

Our Topic lessons have been equally engaging as we delved into the diverse biomes found around the globe. This exploration sets the stage for an exciting project next week—creating models of these biomes using mod-roc.

We have had some great photos sent in by families of equipment being used that they have borrowed.

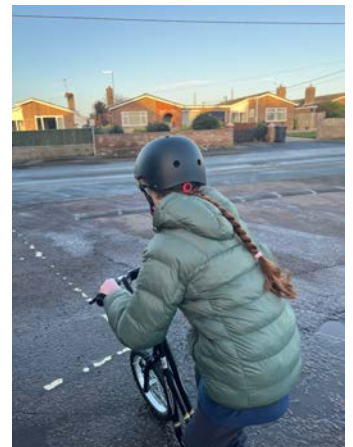

COMMUNICATE CLEARLY

EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION IS ESSENTIAL FOR BUILDING SCHOOL-FAMILY PARTNERSHIPS. MAKE IT EASY FOR PARENTS TO ACCESS ONLINE SAFETY INFORMATION. PLAN YOUR COMMUNICATIONS TO PARENTS SO THAT YOU DON'T HAVE TOO MANY THINGS GOING OUT ON THE SAME DAY AND TRY DIFFERENT WAYS TO INVOLVE THEM.

INVOLVE CHILDREN

INVITING PUPILS TO GET INVOLVED IN SHARING ONLINE SAFETY INFORMATION ENABLES PARENTS/CARERS TO HEAR FIRST-HAND HOW CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE FEEL ABOUT USING TECHNOLOGY, AND WHAT STEPS THEY TAKE TO STAY SAFE.

WHEN CREATING A GROUP, IT'S WORTH CONSIDERING RULES AND ETIQUETTE GUIDES ABOUT WHAT CAN BE POSTED, AND INTRODUCE PROCESSES FOR APPROVING OR RESTRICTING COMMENTS.



4. Posters and infographics

SHARING POSTERS AND INFOGRAPHICS TO PARENTS VIA YOUR WEBSITE OR SOCIAL CHANNELS CAN MAKE ESSENTIAL ONLINE SAFETY INFORMATION ENGAGING AND MEMORABLE. A WELL-DESIGNED INFOGRAPHIC CAN CATCH THE EYE. BREAK DOWN COMPLEX INFORMATION AND PRESENT IT IN A WAY THAT IS BOTH RELEVANT AND UNDERSTANDABLE TO YOUR COMMUNITY.



5. Email Newsletters

All in-term holiday requests will be classed as unauthorised absences. This will likely result in a fixed penalty notice being issued from Norfolk County Council.

In Norfolk, penalty notices are issued in accordance with the Norfolk Local Protocol. In all cases a penalty notice can only be issued if the pupil has accrued at least 9 sessions (4.5 school days) of unauthorised absence within the previous 6 school weeks. This would result in a fine of £60 per child per parent ie; for a family with 2 children this would total £240
